

I, Delia Miller knowing the uncertainty of life, and the
duty of being prepared for death, do make and ordain this my
last will and testament in manner and form as follows.

1st It is my desire that all my just debts shall be paid.
2d I give and bequeath to my husband Samuel Miller the
four hundred dollars now in James R. Jones hands, and all
other property which I may have at my death with the interest
which may accrue thereon.
And I hereby I constitute and appoint Mary T. Henry of the
my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this 14th day of September 1851
At Rappahannock by the testator.

subscribing witnesses to the said will who is dead, and the due execution
of the said will by the said testator, and thereupon the said will
is ordered to be recorded. And at a Court held for the said County at the
Court house thereof on the 14th day of December 1863. This last will of
John Miller dead, was again produced to the Court and on the motion of
Benjamin B. Hensley the executor therein named who made oath thereof
and together with Alexander J. Menzies as his security (who justified on
oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
penalty of \$800.00 conditioned as the law directs acceptance is granted
him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
