

In the name of God, Amen, I Ellen Sick do make & constitute this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me - My will & desire is that my five grand children to-wit Arthur, Mortimer, Amanda M., and Martha E. and William Hawkins children of my deceased daughter Christina Ellen wife of Benjamin Hawkins have & inherit in equal shares all of my estate that I may die seized & possessed of & should any one of them die under the age of twenty one years unmarried then that part or portion of such an one I will & desire to be divided amongst the survivors equally - Lastly I appoint my friend John W Miller to be the Executor of this my last will & Testament - In testimony whereof I have set my hand & seal this 11th day of November 1858
