

Being of sound mind and disposing memory I Francis Millan of the County of
Stafford and State of Virginia

Do after committing my soul to God its Author and final judge make and constitute this my
last will and testament in the name of God amen

First I desire that all my just debts be paid together with my funeral expenses out of
any property that my Executors hereafter named may think best

After which I give to my beloved wife Sarah all the remainder of my property of
any description to hold and enjoy during her natural life and then if any be left

I desire it to be divided among my five children to wit one fifth part to my daughter
Jane Stallard and her heirs, one fifth to my daughter Harriet Smith and her heirs one

fifth to each of my single daughters Ann & Millan and Sarah & Millan and if either
of them die without lawful issue then her part is to go to her other single sister. One

fifth part to John W Millan, James S. Millan and Henry S. Millan having had
already more than any other one of my can get. they are to have no more. But I give

to Sabina Millan wife of H S Millan and her children by said Henry S. Millan a
negro girl Lucinda which I bought of H S Millan in the year 1853, which will more

fully appear by reference to his bill of sale filed with my papers but with the express pro-
vision that Sabina Millan shall pay Sarah Millan my wife the sum of Two Hundred

and twenty five Dollars with interest from the date of Henry S. Millan's bond to
his mother for said money which his mother loaned him sometime in the year 1853

I further desire that my wife take care of my two single daughters Ann and
Sarah whilst they remain single And I do hereby appoint my affectionate wife Execu-
atrix to this my last will and request that the Court will not ask security of her for

the same In testimony of which I have here affixed my hand and seal this 13th day of
May 1856

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Francis Millan Seal

In Rappahannock County Court September 11th 1865

This writing purporting to be the last will of Francis Millan deceased was produced in
Court by Sarah Millan the Executrix therein named and there being no subscribing
witnesses thereto Zepherniah Turner and Daniel W. Kotts were sworn and severally
deposed that they were well acquainted with the testator's handwriting and verily
believe the said writing and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the testator
own hand; whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true Autograph and
and holograph last will of the said Francis Millan deceased and on the motion of Sarah
Millan the Executrix therein named she made oath thereto and entered into bond in
the penalty of \$800 conditioned as the law directs without security, the will of the testator
directing that his said Executrix therein named should not give security and the
Court thinking that security ought not to be required certificate is granted her for obtain-
ing a probat of the said will in due form
