

Index to Rappahannock Co. Virginia Will Bk C, 1849-1855 (Wills and Estates)
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I, Isaac H. Huff of the County of Rappahannock and State of Virginia do hereby make and ordain this as my last will and testament - After the payment of all just debts made during my lifetime and my funeral expenses I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Huff One Half of the Farm upon which I now reside (consisting of about Ten Hundred & Twenty Acres to be held by her and for her use so long as she may live; One Half of my House-hold & Kitchen Furniture, the choir of my Horse, six sheep Two cattle choir. One McCormick and one Shovel Plough to be disposed of as she may see proper - To my Sister Lucinda Huff I give and bequeath the remaining half of the farm absolutely, and after the death of my wife Mary Huff, the whole upon like condition, the other half of the House-hold and Kitchen Furniture. One Horse, second choir, six sheep and two cattle - It is my request that my Mother and wife Sister Jane Canard be permitted to remain with my wife & Sister to be supported by them - I hereby appoint James Compton my Executor. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Fifth day of May in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred & Sixty Two
