

In the name of God Amen I Mary A. widow on the brink
of Rappahannock and state of Virginia being of legal age,
health and of sound and disposing mind and memory, calling
to mind the frailty and uncertainty of human life and being
desirous of settling my worldly affairs and directing how the es-
tates it has pleased God to bless me with shall be disposed of after
my decease while I have strength and capacity to do so, make
and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and
making null and void all other last wills and testaments by
me heretofore made.

And first I commend my immortal being to him who gave it
and my body to ^{the same} to be buried by my executor hereinafter named
without unnecessary expense or ostentation.

As to my worldly affairs, and all the property real personal
or mixed of which I shall die seized and possessed or to which
I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, I desire to dispose
and dispose of in the manner and form following to wit.
In primis my will is that all my just debts and funeral
expenses shall by my executor hereinafter named be
paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as by him
shall be found convenient.

In primis I give and bequeath to my beloved niece Eliza Jane
Richetts daughter of Hezekiah Richetts decd. the sum of seven
hundred dollars in money to be paid to her or her legal guard-
ian by my executor hereinafter named as early as possible
after my decease, to have and to hold the same to her her heirs

after my decease, to have and to hold the same to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Imprimis, I also desire and bequeath to my said niece Eliza Jane Nicholls, one bedstead bed and bedding, one Bureau, one wardrobe and all other articles of household and kitchen furniture of which I may be seized and possessed at the time of my death.

Imprimis All the rest and residue of my estate real personal and mixed of which I shall die seized and possessed or to which I ~~shall~~ be entitled at my decease, I give desire and bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Ann Nicholls, wife of Hegziah Nicholls decd. for her sole separate use and benefit during the term of her natural life, to have hold and enjoy the rents and profits of the same, and at her death it is my will and desire that the same be equally divided amongst my nieces Eliza Jane Nicholls, Martha Nicholls, Betina Nicholls, Nancy Nicholls, Emma Nicholls and Lucinda Nicholls daughters of my sister the said Elizabeth Ann Nicholls wife of Hegziah Nicholls deceased.

Lastly I do nominate and appoint John Elias Nicholls to be the Executor of this my last will and Testament.

Signed sealed and published as the last will and Testament of the said Mary Ann Moore, at her request and in her presence, and in the presence of each other have subscribed as witnesses hereto this 22^d day of November 1861

In Rappahannock County Court August 24th 1864
This last will of Mary A. Anderson deceased was this day
read to the Court & proved by the oath of Clinton W. Hadden and Daniel
O. Waggsby and by the subscribing witnesses thereof and was
to be recorded. And on the motion of John B. Blissett the Court
therein named who made oath thereto and together with James
Myers, Clinton W. Hadden and Daniel O. Waggsby his recorder
who subscribed on oath as to their sufficiency, solvency and ac-
knowledge a bond in the penalty of \$6000. conditioned as the
law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of
the said will in due form.
