1st I give and devise to my nephew Walter Neuman (the son of John Neuman) in trust for his children the sum of three hundred dollars.
2^d I give and devise to my niece Sarah Rice for the use of herself and children Three hundred dollars.

3^d I give and devise to Phoebe Neuman the sum of one hundred dollars.
4th I give and devise to Orlena Peale and Caroline Peale each the sum of one hundred dollars.

5th I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid and after their payment I give and devise the residue of my estate them and I appoint them Executors of this my last will and testament. In testifying whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 27th day of June 1860
