Menefee, Eliza Briggs, Jane E. Robinson and Lucy M. Sparks* should be in
want or likely to come to suffer. I should like for the said *Walter* to give
to any one of them what amount he thinks is best for their own use and support.
To this I appoint my son *Walter O'Bannon* my Executor. in the presence of

recorded. And on the order of the Court the same was

Security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into, and
acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00)
conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probat of the said will in due form.
