figured calico also two quilts and one sheet and a pair of pillows also my new
side saddle - Item 3rd To my daughter Elizabeth Robinson I give one white Cow
pane one comfort three bed quilts, two sheets one bed and bedstead all of which to
be selected by her and designed by me to be the best of all my furniture of the des-
ignation named - Item 4th To my grandson Benjamin Robinson son of Joseph
Robinson I give one Red Buffalo Cow - Item 5th To my daughter Elizabeth Robinson
I also give one pied Heifer - Item 6th To my daughters Elizabeth Robinson and
Catherine Ann Saunders and their bodily heirs I give the residue of my property
or estate whatever to be divided equally between the said Elizabeth Robinson and
Catherine Ann Saunders or in the event of the death of either or both then to their heirs
aforesaid - Item 7th Having determined that the foregoing property named in this
my last will and testament shall not be liable for the debts now owing or hereafter
to be contracted by my sons in law Joseph Robinson and James W. Saunders I hereby
appoint John W. and James R. Miller Trustees for my daughter Elizabeth Robinson
and Catherine Ann Saunders and for my grandchildren Sarah Ellen Saunders
and Benjamin Robinson who shall have the sole right to take a receipt of and
apply the foregoing property in such manner as they shall think just and to
have the effect I have in view that is to give to the parties named the whole and
undivided use of the said property - Item 8th I hereby appoint John W. and
James R. Miller joint and several Executors of my last will and testament

In Rappahannock County Court October 9th 1865
 This last will of Sarah Blackwell deceased was this day produced to the Court perused
 by the oaths of John S. Eto and James R. Miller the subscribing witnesses thereto and
 ordered to be recorded and John S. Eto and James R. Miller the Executors therein named
 here in Court refusing to take upon themselves the burden of the execution thereof: On
 the motion of Alfred Congie who made oath thereto and together with James McConigle
 his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged
 a bond in the penalty of \$400 conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him
 for obtaining letters of administration on the said decedent's estate with her will
 annexed in due form.
