Will^{ch} In the name of God, Amen - I William Tannehill of the
County of Rappahannock and State of Virginia being sick and weak
in body but of sound and disposing memory (for which I thank God)
and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life; and being desirous
to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless
me with do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and
form following. that is to say:

Firstly. I desire all my just debts and funeral expenses to be paid.

Secondly. I desire that all my estate real and personal shall remain in
the possession of my beloved wife Henrietta Tannehill during her natural
life for the benefit of her and my two unmarried daughters Eliza Jane
Tannehill and Nancy Tannehill to be enjoyed as a house by them. (Eliza
Jane and Nancy) during her life with her, but should either of them marry
then shall not be privileged to enjoy the above provisions.

Thirdly. I desire should my wife marry that all my estate shall be
divided according to law with the provisions herein specified giving her
one third during her life and the other two thirds to be divided equally
amongst all my children. The household and kitchen furniture I desire
when my estate shall be divided to be given to my two daughters Eliza
Jane and Nancy in consideration of services rendered by them.

Fourthly. After the death my beloved wife I desire that my whole
estate that was and personal estate the furniture above specified
shall be sold to the highest bidder and the proceeds thereof

equally between all my children for the use and benefit of
them and their heirs forever.

Lastly. I devise and hereby appoint my son Joseph H. Hannickill
my executor to fulfill this my last will and testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 25th day of May 1858.

And the renunciation in writing of Joseph H. Tannehill under his hand and seal of the burthen of the execution of this last will and testament of his deceased father William Tannehill, - the said Joseph H. Tannehill being named and appointed as the Executor of the said last will and testament, was this day produced to the Court, and the said renunciation having been acknowledged before a Justice of the Peace in the County of Augusta by the said Joseph H. Tannehill as appears from the certificate of such acknowledgement made by the said Justice and thereto annexed, was ordered to be filed. And on the motion of Enoch, J. Holmes, administrator with this said last will and testament annexed of William Tannehill deceased is granted to the said Enoch J. Holmes, who made oath thereto and together with William B. Fogg, and William M. Wetherage, his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4500) conditioned as the Law directs.
