Amen. Almighty God to call & I hopeing to be pastore of the Gleasons before sermons  
through out God's Word by the Almighty Power of His Grace.  
Say Will and Testament in manner and forme following.  
Item - first and principally I give my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to  
the Earth which I have receaved in trust from God and am now  
Touching the Disposition of such Temporal Estate and hath pleased, Almighty  
God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof in the following manner and  
form -

Item. - I Will that my Debts and funeral Charges be first paid and Discharged  
Item. - I Give and Bequeath my Plantation and Lands wherpon I now live to my  
Loving Wife Elizabeth Baker during her Natural life and after her  
Death to my son William Baker and his heirs Lawfully begotten and in  
case he Dies without heirs Lawfully begotten I ente returning to Samuell Baker  
and his heirs for ever and in case he Dies without such heir that is to say  
my son Sam. I ente to Bartholomew Baker and his heirs for ever Lawfully  
Begotten,

Item. - I give and Bequeath all my personal Estate to my said Loving Wife  
During her life and after her Decease to her six Children Namely  
William, Samuell, Bartholomew, Constant, Jakinse, and Elizabeth  
Baker, and the Child that my said Wife is now Labouring with & not  
born to him and their heirs for ever to be Equally Divided.

Item. Lastly I Ordaine constitute and appoint my Loving Wife Elizabeth  
Baker sole Executive of this my last Will and Testament looking  
and making Vale all the Testimony wherefore made in witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and sealed the 28th day of

Item. I give and bequeath all my personal Estate to my said loving Wife during her life and after her decease to her six children namely William, Samuel, Bartholomew, Constant, Johnstone, and Elizabeth Baker, and the Child that my said Wife is now Labouring with & not born, till then and their heirs for ever to be Equally Divided -

Item. Lastly. I Ordain Constitute and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Baker Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament Revoking and making Void all her Wills by me before made the which whereof I have hereunto set my hand and sealed the last Day of December 1722 - - -
