Debts satisfied to be Equally divided betwene my two Daughters
Margaret and Deborah when they come to y^e Age of Eighteen
Years or at y^e Day of Mar^{ch} And further I Do hereby give and
appoint my true and well beloved friend Inhabitant of the
aforesaid County to be my true and lawfull Ex^{or} to so this my
Last Will and Testament performe and Discharge all other
Will or Wills testament or testamentary by me made or to be made
to be void and this to be taken for my Last Will and Testament
whereof I have herunto set my hand and fixed my Seale this
2nd Day of Jan^{ry} 1717
