being at this time of sound sense and memory have thought proper to
make the following Disposition of the Estate it hath pleased ^{the} Almighty Gods
Will upon me the twenty second Day of May in the year of our Lord 1760
Being satisfied with the provision & Division that the same be made of my
Estate between my dear wife & Child should they both live my desire is
the same be divided according thereto but if it should happen that my son Charles
should die before he arrives to ~~the~~ full age in the lifetime of his mother ---

Then it is my will, y^e do give the Land whereon I now live and one halfe of all
my slaves (that I have with me in Slaves) unto my dear wife and her heirs
For ever and the other halfe of my said Slaves Land at the mountain &
other Estate I give and devise to be Equally divided between my several
God children & nephews viz. Thomas Beale surron Beal Ann Hamilton
or John Eustace Beale & Charles Beale the son of my Brother Taverner and
their Heirs for ever - - - - -

But in case my wife should die during the minority of my said son and he
should die afterwards under age Then I give all my Estate to be Equally divided
between my said God children and Nephews and their Heirs for ever - -
I do hereby empower my Executors here after mentioned either by the sale
of my sons Estate or by the sale of such of his Negroes as they shall think
fit to purchase the Land whereon the widow Walker & William a laborer now
live & of M^r Annys orphans if they think proper and if not to purchase or purchase shall be made

for to purchase the Land whereon the widow William Alderson now
lives. If Henrys orphans if they think proper and of such purchase shall be made
I make them liable to the same Limitations and Dispositions as are Express'd in the two several Com-
plices above mentioned And I thus Improve them Either by the Sale of any part of my Slaves or other Estate
to pay what Debt I shall owe or take up money upon Interest for that Purpose

M I do Nominate and appoint my brother Richard Keble my Nephews Thomas Keble and Austin Brooker
brought on my said Son Charles Keble when he shall arrive to proper age the Executors of this my last
Will and Testament hereby bequeathing all Wills heretofore by me made And lastly I do appoint my
brothers William Keble Richard Keble and William Brooker brought Guardians of my said Son during
his Minority During that my dear wife may be consulted by them in what they shall do with regard
