this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following Viz: -

Item, I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Bryan my Negro Boy James
Item My will and desire is that all my personal Estate be ^{equally} divided
between my wife & Children Thomas Bryant, Ann Bryant, Betty Bryant, John
Bryant & Peggy Bryant -

Item I Give the use of my boy Dick and my Negro woman Mimah and her
future Increase for the support and maintenance of my said Children
During their Infancy And my desire is that as well the said two Negroes
Dick and Mimah as the^r Increase upon my said Children
Coming to age shall then be equally divided among my said Children
But if any of my Children shod die, having a Child or Children before
the death -

But if any of my Children should die, having a Child or Children before the death of my said wife it is my desire that in such case such Child or Children shall take the same part of such Negroes as their Parents should have had, if he or she had been alive —

And Lastly I do constitute and ordain James Forester & William Forester whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament discharging all other will or wills before by me made. In Witness whereof I have set my hand & Seal this 28.th day of January Anno Domini 1751.
