 North Taranham Parish being sick and Weak in Body but Perfect sense and Memory
 Do make and beain this to be my Last Will and Testament in Manner and Form
 Following To wit I give my son Thomas Hinds all my Land on the North side of a branch
 beginning at Taranham Bridge and up the said branch to Williams Line att which
 Said Piece of Land I give to my said son Thomas Hinds and his Heirs for Ever --
 But in Case my said son Thomas should Dye without Issue Male that then the said
 Land to go and Decend unto my son Charles and his Heirs for Ever. Item I give to my
 Son Richard Hinds all the Remainder of my Land to him and his Heirs for ever
 But if my son Richard should Dye without Issue Male that then the said Land
 To go and Decend unto my son Josiah and his Heirs for ever. Item I give to my
 Son Thomas Hinds my yoke of steers together with my Cart and Wheels and also
 My Plough Also I give him three Cows and one yearling and five Choice Hogs and
 Five shoots Also I give him four Choice ewes and my young Mare and saddle
 Item my will and Desire is that all the Rest of my Hogs Cattle Horses and sheep

Item: my will and Desire is that all the Rest of my Hogs Cattle Horses and sheep
Not Already given be sold by my Executors Also thirty Gallons of Brandy and
Anon saddle and Bridle and fifty Gallons of Cyder and one bed Table and also what
Corn that can be spared after the Winter is over All which said stock and goods
I desire may be sold by my Executors and the money arising therefrom to be applyed
Towards the Support Maintaining and Educating my three youngest Children Richard
Hinds Charles Hinds and Josiah Hinds my will and Desire is that my friend
Christopher Lawson take my son Richard Hinds to Bring up in such manner as he
In his Directions shall think most proper Also it is my will that my friend Joseph
Woolard take my youngest son Josiah Hinds to Bring up in such manner as he shall
In his Directions Judge most convenient for him Also it is my will and Desire that
My friend Mr James Downman take my son Charles Hinds to Bring up in such way
As shall in his Discretion think most Reasonable Item: my will and Desire is that each
Of my said three Children that above Mentioned and Dispose of have two Barrills of
Indian Corn and the meat of two Hogs that is Already Kill'd to wards their supports
This Present year Item: I give my Daughter Judith Hinds the Bed and Furniture

In his Directions Judge most Convenient for him Also it is my will and Desire that
My friend Mr James Downman take my son Charles Hinds to bring up in such way
As shall in his Discretion think most Reasonable It is my will and Desire is that each
Of my said three Children that Above Mentioned and Disposed of have two Barrells of
Indian Corn and the meat of two Hogs that is already Kill'd towards their support
This Present year It is my will and Desire that my Daughter Judith Hinds the Bed and Furniture
Whereon she Commonly Lies And also the Box that is Bedd Hens and what New
Virginia Cloth there is and the Largest Piece of white Linning there is in the house
And all the Rest of the Linning I give to my three youngest sons And my will and Desire
Is that after my Debts are Paid that my Daughter Judith Hinds have one third of the
Remainder of my Crop of Tobacco and all the Rest of my whole Estate Not already
Given and Disposed of I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Hinds except the use
Of as much Corn Ground as contains four thousand Corn Holes and Ground for
Four thousand Tobacco Hills in such Part of my Land as is most Convenient not
Defrauding the due for the use of Joseph Woodland towards the bringing up of my son

I Josiah and I, Here by Nominate constitute and Appoint my true Friends Christopher
Lawson and Joseph Woolford my Executors to this my Last will Testament Revoking
All Others Heretofore by me made In witness whereof I have my hand and seal this
6 Day of January 1760
