In manner and form following that is to say first & principally I resign my soul into the merciful hands of Almighty God my Creator & surely hoping through the merits of ^{His} blessed Saviour to obtain remission of all my sins and my Body I commit to the Earth whence it was taken to be Decently Buried by the Discretion of my Executors here after named and as for the worldly Goods the Lord hath Sent me I Dispose thereof as followeth —

I Leave to my Dear wife Bridgett Lovelace the Plantation Town live on formerly called Rich Creek wth a hundred and fifty Acres of Land and all the rest of my Estate During Life or widowhood then the said Land above mentioned to return to Charles Lovelace and his heirs for ever —

At A Court held for Richmond County the second day of August 1736 —
This writing was Presented in Court by the within named Bridget Lovelace as the Last will of her husband Charles Lovelace Decd. and failing to prove the same to be wrote by the said Charles Lovelace and not being signed it is the opinion of the Court the same should not be admitted to Record whereupon Charles Lovelace Elder son & heir at Law to the aforesd Charles Lovelace Decd. Personally appeared in Court and Prayed that the said writing should be recorded as the Last will of his Father aforesd. and the same is ordered Accordingly

ing that is to say first & principally I resign my soul into the merciful hands of Almighty God my Creator assuredly hoping through the merits of blessed Saviour to obtain remission of all my sins and my Body I commit to the Earth whence it was taken to be Decently Buried by the Discretion of my Executors here after named and as for the worldly Goods the Lord hath Sent me I Dispose them of as followeth —

I Send to my Dear wife Bridgett Lovelace the Plantation I now live on formerly called Rich Neck wth a hundred and fifty Acres of Land and all the rest of my Estate During Life or widowhood then the said Land above mentioned to return to Charles Lovelace and his heirs for ever —

At A Court held for Richmond County the second day of August 1756 —
This writing was Presented in Court by the within named Bridget Lovelace as the Last will of her husband Charles Lovelace Dec^d and failing to prove the same to be made by the said Charles Lovelace and not being signed it is the opinion of the Court the same should not be admitted to Record whereupon Charles Lovelace Eldest son & heir at Law to the aforesaid Charles Lovelace Dec^d Personally appeared in Court and Prayed that the said writing should be recorded as the Last will of his Father aforesaid and the same is ordered Accordingly
