of Parish of Northfarnham in the County of Richmond and Colony of Virginia
being in his right and perfect sense bequeathing his Soul unto the hands of
almighty God that gave it and his Body to the earth to be decently Interred -
the same by his Executors hereafter named And as for this temporal Estate
he gives and bequeathes it in this form and manner following. -

Imp: I give and bequeath unto my Son Charles one father bed and bolster, 2119 and
two blankets and one horse Bridle and a saddle and a large pot one pultr distle
and three Plates, Six Spuns, a large Bannockstick, a fair pair and a set of
Hangers. -

Item. It is my Will and desire that all the remainder part of my Estate whatsoever
be equally divided into four equal parts unto my Wife and three Children. -

Lastly. It is my Will and desire that my Wife be my sole and sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 27 Day of May 1713. -
