Sinead's Will. in the parish of Littenbourn being sick of Body but of perfect Sense and memory
Do make and Ordaine this to be my last Will and Testament in manner
and forme following hereby Revoking and Disannulling and making
void all other and former Wills heretofore made by me and Declaring this
only to be my last Will and Testament

I Bequeath my Soul into the hands of the Almighty God that Giveth my

Greater Trusting through the Merits of Iesus Christ to receive
pardon for all my sins and my body to Christian burial and as for all my worldly
estate I dispose of them in manner and forme as followeth

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Keith for her life time and
after her Decease then my grand Daughter Sarah Keith to have the said parcell
of Land beginning at a Black Oak Standing by a path side which divides the
Land from William Griffin Land so down the the branch from the said Black
Oak along a line of marked trees to a Road or standing in the heart of a
Swamp from whence beginneth a branch or Swamp running along the said
Swamp severall Courses to a maine Swamp Commonly called by the name
of the Beaver Dam running up the Beaver Dam crossing the land to a
Maple being a corner tree of a line belonging to John Morton so along the
s. Morton line to a Stake or post standing by the Road side so along the s.
Road path to the beginning Black Oak including severall Acres of Land
more or less which said Land I give to my Daughter Eliz Keith for her
life time and after her Decease then my grand Daughter Sarah Keith
to have the said parcell of Land for her and her heirs Lawfully begotten
of her Body for Ever

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Charles I send the upper part or half
of the plantation and Land whereon I now live to him and his heirs
Lawfully begotten of his Body for Ever and in Case he Dies without
Issue Lawfully begotten of his Body then his part of Land to goe to

bequeath of his Body then the 3. part of land to go to my Son Charles Inod or
his heirs I lawfully bequeath of his Body for Ever

Item I Give unto my Son Charles and James Inod or their heirs for Ever all
the land that my father takes and the other 1/2 of the Beaver Dam

Item My Will is that my loving Wife Sarah Inod shall her living upon my
plantation so long as she keeps her selfe a Widdow

And I Do hereby make and constitute and appoint my my loving Wife
Sarah Inod and my Son Charles Inod to be my whole and sole executrix and
Executor to do this my last Will and Testament for forme of the Testimony where-
of I have herunto set my hand and seal this fourth Day of April 1724
