Greater crossing through the Morass of Biggs between from Elizabethtown
Funder for all my Sons and my Son's Children and others for all my
Children & offsprings of them to me to be given as follows:

Item. Give and I require unto my Daughter Elizabeth Hall for her self and her
wife the 2nd Mrs. Elizabeth Hall daughter of John Hall to have the said parcel
of land beginning at a Stake Oak standing by a path side which Doctor (Dr.)
Soren from William Griffen Esq. doth describe the branch from thence in black
Oak along a line of wood from the Stake Oak to the boundary line thereof for
Early from whence it begins to run and swamp running along the said
Swamp several courses to a main Swamp Commonly called by the name
of the Seven Pines running up from Seven Pine Brook & going the said land to a
stake being a corner tree of a line belonging to John Marion so along the
Marion line to a Stake or post standing by the 2nd Dr. Soren along the
Road path to the beginning the 2nd Dr. Soren being about a mile off said
tree or stake which said place I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Hall for her
life time and after her decease then my Grand Daugher Elizabeth Hall
to have the said parcel of land for her and her heirs lawfully begotten
of her Body for ever.

Item. Give and I require unto my Son Charles Hall the 1st Dr. Soren
of his plantation and of all the land he now has in sum with the land
lawfully begotten of his Body for his heirs and the descendants
of his lawfully begotten of his Body then his said land to go to
