and Parish of Surinburg being very sick & weak of body but of perfect &
sound mind and memory thanks be to God for the same and knowing there
is a time appointed for all men Once to die do make and ordain this my last
will and testament In manner and form as follows first I give my Soul
to Almighty God who gave it me hoping to Receive the same at the day of
Resurrection through the merits of my blessed saviour Jesus Christ and
my body I Give to the Parish to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors
hereafter mentioned and as for my worldly Estate after my Debts & funeral
Charges are paid I Give and bequeath It as follows —

Item I Give to my son John Mozinge one feather bed and bedstead with the proper
furniture thereto belonging —

Item I Give that part of my land upto my tobacco house to my son Edwards &
the remainder of my land to my son George to them & their heirs forever

will and testament in manner as aforesaid, I give & bequeath
to Almighty God who gave it me hoping to Receive the same at the day of
Resurrection through the merits of my blessed saviour Jesus Christ and
my body I give to the Lenth to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors
hereafter mentioned and as for my worldly Estate after my Debts & funeral
Charges are paid I Give and bequeath It as follows —

Item I Give to my son John Mozings one feather bed and bedstead with the proper
furniture thereto belonging —

Item I Give that part of my land upto my tobacco house to my son Edwards &
the remainder of my land to my son George to them & their heirs forever
Reversing only, that If George Henson & Margaret his wife think fit
they shall live on the sd land seven Years yielding and paying Rent
Yearly four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco —

Item I Give to my son Edward one feather bed whereon I now Lay together
with the furniture thereof, Three pewter Dishes, six plates and a pewter

Bason, a leather bag a stone bag my best and all therein my Mare
Bridle and Saddle —

Item I Give to my son George a feather bed in a trunk bedstead together
with the furniture thereof, three pewter dishes six plates and one pewter
Bason and a leather butter pot and a horse bridle and saddle —

Item I Give to my Daughter Margaret six pewter plates one bason and
three leather milk pans —

Item I Give to my Daughter in law Hannah three leather milk pans and
a tin Cullinder —

Item I Give to my Daughter Sarah Chandler five pewter plates one leather
plate and a pewter bason —

And as for the rest of my Estate whatsoever I Give to my son Edward
and my son George to be Equally divided between them & their heirs
forever —

And I do hereby will & ordain that my said son Edward Mazingo &
George Mazingo be Executors of this last will and Testament. In Witness
