 to be decently interred according to the Ceremonies of the Protestant Episcopal Church
 as to my worldly Goods, I give & bequeath them in the following manner, Inprimis it is my
 earnest Will and desire, that all my Just debts and funeral Charges be first fully paid and
 Satisfied and an ample Compensation made to my Executors for their trouble in Collecting
 Settling and paying the same, Item I give and bequeath to my friend Mrs. Minerva
 Cook the wife of Mr. John Cook of Northumberland County my Black Horses harness
 of the Saddle together with all my wearing Apparel of any kind and the trunks Boxes and
 Trunks in which they are contained, Item I give and bequeath to my Friends Mrs.
 Minerva Ametrad and the aforementioned Mrs. Cook and to their heirs & assigns forever
 all the rest, Residue and Remains of my Estate be it of what nature or kind soever to be
 Equally Divided between them here & there alike.

Winnifred Armistead and the aforementioned Mrs. Cook and to their heirs & assigns forever
all the rest, Residue and Remains of my Estate be it of what nature or kind soever to be
Equally Divided between them share & share alike - Lastly I appoint my Brother
Lekey Peachy and my Kinsman Bartholomew M. Carty Executors of this my last Will

Thousand Seven Hundred & eighty Nine & in the fourteenth Year of the Common Wealth
