for the same in Current money.

Apparel and Cloathing of what kind soever...
I give to my Relation Robert Hottel a Downman and his wife and seven
my Negro Slave called Jenny...
My Will is and I desire that all the Tract of Land whereon I now live
with the appurtenances thereto belonging to Traverse Downman of Richmond
County and to his heirs and assigns forever and it is my Desire that the said

that Tract of Land belonging to me lying in the Parish near Tottery
Green and whereon I have at present a quarter for as much as may be got
for the same in Current money.

I Devise to my affectionate Sister Mrs Procella Chinn all my wearing
Apparel or Cloathing of what kind so ever.

I Give to my Relation Robert Northes Townman and his wife of my
my Negro Slave called Jimmy.

My Will is and I do hereby Devise all the Tract of Land whereon I now live
with the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Townman of Middlesex
County and to his heirs and assigns forever and it is my Desire that the said
Land and appurtenances may be Valued in Current money by Indifferent
and Disinterested Persons and upon such Valuation it shall appear
that the Value thereof shall not be equal to a Twentieth of the True Value
of my personal Estate hereafter Given and Devise to and among
several of my Relations hereafter respectively named and mentioned
then and in that case it is my Will and Intention that the said Townman
shall have and Receive as much out of my said Estate as

be divided and shall appear up the same in value equal with their several
Respective Dividends.

In order to prevent any dispute which may arise after my decease concern-
ing or concerning the Right of those Slaves that is Men and their Children
and Grand Children then and every of their several and Respective Spouse
and having been so fully mentioned in a certain Deed of Gift bearing date
as my Relation Capt Robert Dorman and after Recorded in Prerogative
Court for the County of Middlesex the Regd Slaves as aforesaid to
him and his heirs forever.

Devise all the Rest and Remainder of my Regd and Personal Estate
whatsoever and among my Relations and kindred hereafter Respective
and particularly named equally to be Divided there is to my one equal share
or Dividend thereof Devise to Capt Robert Dorman for his Repairs
and many Services done for me for many years Past and to my other
Relations that is Mr William Dorman of Richmond County
Bartholomew Dorman of the Kingdom of Great Britain George Steele
John Dorman Mrs Betty Lee of Lancaster County William Dorman
of Northumberland County John Dorman of Prince Georges

of Northumberland County Jacob Downman of Prince William
County my first Daughter Miss Elizabeth Glascock the Daughter of
M^r. William Glascock of Richmond M^r. Elizabeth Merrett the
Wife of M^r. Willington M^r. Carty of the County aforesaid To each and every
of them severally Give and Devise equal Shares or Dividend thereof and
further Give and Devise one other Share or Dividend thereof and among
the Children of the late Deceased Major George Glascock to be equally
Divided among them and lastly the other Shares or Dividend thereof to
and among the Children of the late Deceased James Downman to be
Equally Divided among them.

Finally I hereby nominate and appoint my Friends and Relations
M^r. William Glascock William Downman Robert Downman of
Richmond County and M^r. George Heale of Lancaster County to be
Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby Resolving all other

This Will was presented in Court by Robert Downman and
William Downman one of the Executors therein named who made
oath thereunto according to Law and being Read by the witness of the Court
was admitted to Record and on the motion of the said Executors

giving him my certificate of payment therefor retaining a Receipt therefor
in the form of -----

The last will of Walter Wallace of Richmond County declared by him to be
Sauldick and Gordon my al Sauldick the twenty first day of April last
at the house of the said Depoents being then much indisposed and having
come there as they understood for that purpose being about to enter into a
course of Physicians and Physicians do say that his wife then with that it
should be his last will that is his last will and he gave me his will which
I saw and one Reginald named Henry all my horse and which they
understood horses and mares all the money which was due to him and
out of that he should pay Doctor Robinson the Bond and should discharge
be more the overplus to be paid out of his estate and that his son George should
have unequal share of the Remainder of his estate with the best as they understood
thereby meaning his wife and daughter and further said that the Depoents
further declared that the said Walter had departed this life yesterday at his own
habitation.
Which said Will was read into
writing as the same is
