After the death of my Wife I devise my Land to my son Merry
man Bryant of his Heirs for ever

I bequeath my Negroe man Adam after my said wifes decease to my
son Moses Bryant

The Rest & remain of my Estate I give & bequeath to my said
two sons after my said wifes decease to be equally divided between them
I Nominate constitute & hereby appoint my said son Merryman
Bryant Executor of this my last will & Testament revoking all others
heretofore before made In Testimony whereof I have set my hand &
Seal the day of May 2 1764

heretofore by me made in Testimony whereof There to ~~put~~ my hand &
Seal the day of May 2, 1864
