with my wife till they arrive to the age of Twenty one years
I Give my Will and desire is that the Remainder of part of my Estate
after all my Just Debts are paid be Equally Divided between my
wife and all my children
I Give and appoint my Loving Wife and my friend Willie
Garland to be my whole and sole Executors of this my Last Will
