In the Name of God Amen I Henry Sagar of the Parish of
Sagar's Will North Hamham in the County of Richmond being sick and weak in
Body but Reason perfect and disposing Mind and Memory, Do give
be therefore given to Almighty God, Do make and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner & form following (that is to say)
I do hereby bequeath my Goods into the hands of Almighty
God being through the Ministry of a Minister of my Religion
to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of
all my sins and to be buried at the last will of my Body to be carried
to the Church to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors
hereinafter named, And as touching the disposition of all such
Temporal Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, I give
and dispose thereof as followeth: -

Imprimis. I will that my Executors and General Executors shall be paid -
debts & discharged: -

Item. I give and bequeath unto Christopher Mough and Ann Mough
Son and Daughter of Thomas Mough dec^d to each of them the
sum of three Thousand pounds of Tob^{co} -

Item. I give unto Thomas Wright Bofford's Son of M^r. Joseph Bofford
of the County of Lincoln the sum of -

Item. I give unto the said Henry Sisson my Negro Woman Calista with a Negro Boy, Calista's Son, which said Negroes are to be the future -
Inheritance of the said Henry Sisson.

Item. I give and bequeath unto the said Henry Sisson my Negro Girl called Fanny and her heirs for ever a Negro Girl called Fanny and her heirs future Inheritance.

Item. I will Order and appoint that my Executor or Executors shall from and immediately after my Death be absolutely free and discharged from all Servitude or Slavery to any Man or Persons whatsoever and I do give unto the said Son the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling and also all my wearing Cloaths and one Mare Colt collection to the said Son: Obedt May all which I charge and require my Executors to do punctually perform and pay according to this my Will.

Item. My Will and pleasure is that the Negroes belonging by this my Will given to the said Henry Sisson remain Contained & be upon the Plantation of the said Henry Sisson which I give to the said Henry Sisson, untill the said Henry Sisson shall Arrive to the Age of Eighteen Years and that the profits of the said Acres until that time shall be to the better Support of the said Henry Sisson and his Brothers & Sisters which shall remain upon the said Plantation.

Item. All the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate whatsoever I do give and bequeath unto the said Henry Sisson his heirs Executors and Admin. And I do make, constitute and appoint the said Henry Sisson whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament And I do likewise request and desire William Sisson Brother to the said Henry Sisson to be Executor in trust to look after the said Henry Sisson and his Estate by this Will given and devised unto him till

of the S^d W^m upon which I pay to the said John Thompson, until the said Henry shall arrive to the age of Eighteen Years, and that the profits of the said negro until that time shall be the better support of the said Henry & his mother & the said S^d W^m which shall remain upon the said Plantation: —

Item All the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate whatsoever I do give and bequeath unto the said Henry Ligon his heirs Executors and Admin^{rs} And I do make, constitute and appoint the said Henry Ligon whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament And I do likewise request and desire William Ligon Brother to the said Henry Ligon to be Executor in trust to look after the said Henry Ligon and his Estate by this Will given and appointed to him till such time that he shall come to the Age of Eighteen Years.
