And Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and
Form following. Principally I Commend my Soul unto the
Hands of Almighty God who gave it me & my body to the Earth
To be Decently Buried in a Christian Manner at the discretion
Of my Executor Hereafter Named And as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give
Devise & dispose thereof in Manner following, I Give &
Bequeath unto my friend Robert Spence all the Plantation -
Whereon I now Dwell which I bought of Mr John Jordan he

paying the sum of money for it that I stand Charged to Mr.
John Jordan for it. I Give & Bequeath unto Sarah Greenstreet
And Elizabeth Greenstreet All the Crop Tobac. Made by me & family
In the year 1759. to be Equally divided between them together with
my best Feather Bed & Furniture & All the Wool & Cotton now
In the House & Cotton now growing on my Plantation
I Give & bequeath unto the said Sarah & Elizabeth Greenstreet
And George Fisher All the Crop of Tobacco Corn & Made on my
Plantation this Present year 1760. to be Equally divided Amongst
them. I Give unto the said George Fisher the Sum of three
Pounds ten Shillings & my fine Hatt I Give & bequeath
Unto the foresaid Sarah & Elizabeth Greenstreet my Spinning Wheels
Cards & one Small Box for their Use jointly. & to the said Sarah
Greenstreet I Give one Cow Called Pretty and to the said Elizabeth
I Give one Heifer Called Shannando. I Will is that

Plantation this Present year 1760. to be Equally divided Amongst
them I TERN I Give unto the said George Fisher the Sum of three
Pounds ten Shillings & my fine Hatt I TERN I Give & bequeath
Unto the foresaid Sarah & Elizabeth Greenstreet my Spinning Wheels
Cards & one Small Box for their Use jointly & to the said Sarah
Greenstreet I Give one Cow Called Betty and to the said Elizabeth
I Give one Heifer Called Shannando I TERN My Will is that
All ^{of} Singular the Residue & remaining Part of my Estate both
Real & Personal Shall be sold at Auction & all debts due from
Me to be discharged Out of it I TERN I Give & bequeath unto
Vincent Jenkins son of William Jenkins & Francis his now wife
the Sum of five Pounds Curr^t. to be paid Out of the Money arising
from the Sale of my Estate as before Mentioned I TERN I Give &
bequeath to my two Nephews & Niece Namely John Barker son of

William Barker my brother Joshua Jenkins son of Richard Jenkins
And Sibella his now wife & Ann Spence Daughter of William Spence
And Sarah his now wife All the Remainder of the said Money arising
From the Sale of my Estate, my debt Discharged & the said sum of five
Pounds deducted as before Recited to be Equally divided Amongst them
And to be paid them when they arrive at Lawfull Age to Claim and
that the said Money allotted for the said three Children shall be put
Out to Interest at the discretion of my Executor Untill the said Children
Are by Law Capable to Claim it / Lastly I Ordain Constitute & Appoint
Cap. Moore Fawtleroy my sole Executor of this my Last Will and
Testament Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my
Last will and Testament disannulling and Revoking All other
Wills Bequests and Legacies by me in anywise Willed Bequeathed
And left Heretofore / In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my
Hand and Fixed my Seal the day Month and year first within
