will doo think proper to Dispose of what Estate the Lord have bestowed on me in
manner and form as followeth viz -

First I Recommend my soule to God who gave it me and hope through
the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ I will Enter into the Kingdom of
heaven & my Body to be Decently Buried as my Executors hereafter
named shall think fit of - - -

Item - I Give to my son in law Richard James my wearing sword and my
Daughter Frances James Twenty shillings Current money to buy her a Ring -

Item - I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Ingo my plantation and all
the land thereunto belonging and ffore Negroes James Goss, Mago, Sara,
Aob and their Yellow to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her own
Body -

Item - Further I Give to my Daughter Mary Ingo Two parts of my personally
Estate after my debts and Charges be Defrayed -

Item - I Leave to my Wife Frances Ingo the use of ffore Negroes During her
Natural life James Goss, Pat, Doff, Rose, and one part in three parts
of my personally Estate and after her Decease to Returne to my
Daughter Mary Ingo & - - -

And if my Daughter Mary Ingo Dyeth without issue law of her own
Body lawfully begotten then I Give all my Real Estate and personal

to my Gran Daughter Mary James and her heirs for ever lawfully Begotten
and for want of such heirs to the first Child Male or female that my Daughter
Frances James shall have And for which I do appoint and Ordaine this to be my
last Will and Testament and do appoint and Ordaine my well beloved Wife and
my Daughter Mary James to be my Executors of this my Will and that they each
take to their parts at the day of my Death Given from and in my hand and
seal this the 30 of Decemb^r Anno Domini 1722
