I have Given to my Loving Wife all My Whole Estate During
the time of her Natural Life or Widowhood if she should
Survive my Will & Desire is that my Estate that shall be
Left be Equally Divided amongst my Wife & all my Children
Namely Vincent Sandman Catharine Sandman &

Family Vincent Landman Catharine Landman &
Fanny Landman

for Constitute & appoint my Loving Wife Elizabeth Landman
& my Brother George Landman my Whole & Sole Executors of
this my Last Will & Testament.
