And I Give to my uncle Benjamin Bronham all my whole Estate whole and
Intire to him and his heirs forever only my Desire is that he Give to
said Bronham, Samuel Bronham and John Bronham 2/6 Each
to constitute and appoint my uncle Benjamin Bronham my Heir
and intire Executor of this my Last Will and Testament.

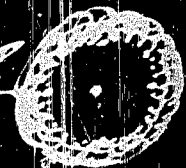
