cuting and lawfully bechoosing It shall partake of the glorious Resurrection &  
purchased by that precious Blood and merits of our dear Lord and Saviour Jesus  
Christ and as for that worldly Estate God of his goodness hath bestowed on me after  
my debts paid and funeral Charges discharged.

Item. I Give unto George Taylor the Son of Simon Taylor one hundred shewes of Land  
which I do give unto my plantation which Land I Give and bequeath unto him and  
his heirs for Ever lawfully begotten or to be begotten of his own body and for my Will.

It em. I Give and bequeath unto my two Sisters Mary and Elizabeth Mackguyre the  
Romanore part of my Land to be Equally divided between them and their heirs for ever.

Item. I Give my horse to John Taylor the Son of Simon Taylor and further I do make  
Simon Taylor my holly Exe<sup>r</sup> of this my Last Will and Testament as witness my  
hand the day and year first above Written.
