

Testament of John Jones

Jones's Will

In the Name of God Amen I John Jones of I Welsh Parish in  
Richman County being weak in Body but sound in Mind and memory  
this my Last Will and Testament first I give my Soul to God and my  
Body to <sup>the</sup> Earth. Next I give my part of a black <sup>and white</sup> cow which I give  
to my Sister then I give to her Cuirass and to her by hand the whole of them  
I give my Spence Coat and one Shute of grey druggall Cloth with a pair  
of breeches I give my Gun to Elizabeth Combs and a Gold Ring to  
Circumstances I give my large Libell to my Mother with the  
Lynce and then to my Sister Ann Combs and as for all my other goods  
after my funeral I charge in part I give to Thomas Brown and do  
make Thomas Brown my true and lawful Executor to my Will  
to have a funeral sermon. Witness My hand and Seal this 15  
Day of March 1719 in the Presence of

first Day of April 1719

This Will was proved in Court before the Justices of  
the Peace of Richman County the 15th day of  
March and admitted to Record
