one best Chest as also all the meat and Corn that I have on the Plantation  
Six best hogs to my will and Desire that if there should be any large  
on the ground at the time that my grandson John Harford should  
have it after paying my other grandson Thomas Harford one  
Third Part as also my oval Table. - - - - -

It is my will and desire that all the Proceeds of my Estate be equally  
Divided between my two Daughters Mary Farley and Wilmoth

Testament. Now making all others heretofore made in writing  
whome I have been unto at my hand and seal this 29 Day of June  
1762
