Item I Give and bequeath unto my son John Clark a certain part of my land
whereon he now lives Lying on the East side of a branch of the Drinking Swamp
leading up to the road that leads from Totuskey to the beach road & on the
South side of the said Road To him and the heirs of his Body Lawfully begotten
forever. Item I Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Clarks all the
Remaining part of the land that I hold on the south East side of the said road
To her the said Mary Clark and the heirs of her body Lawfully begotten forever
And for want of such to the next heir at Law.

Item I Give & bequeath unto my son Robert Clark the Plantation on the North
West side of the said road To him my said son Robert & the heirs of his body
Lawfully begotten forever, And for want of such to next heir at Law.

Lawfully begetten forever, And for want of such to next kin at Law —

Item, I give to my son Robert Clark and my Daughter Mary Clark each of them one feather bed & furniture, two Coats & Colours, two dishes and half a Dozen plates. —

Item, I give to my Grandson John Bently an equal part of my Personal Estate after Debts & Legacies paid To be paid him at the age of twenty one years. And if the^r Bently Does not live to the age afores^d. Then his part to be Equally Divided amongst all the rest of my Children —

Item, I give unto my wife Elizabeth Clark the use of all the rest of my Estate During her Natural life, And after to be Equally Divided amongst all my Children or the legal representatives of them If any be dead —

Lastly, I do Nominate and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Clark and my son John Clark Exec^{rs} & Ad^{rs} of this my Last will and Testament —
