In the Name of God Amen, I Joseph Dale of Richmond
County and parish of Northhamham, being weak & low in health
but of perfect mind and Memory, thanks be to God for the Same,
do make this my last Will & Testament in Manner and form
following &

Imprimis, It is my will and desire that my loving Wife Elizabeth
have the use of my two Negro Boys, by the Name of Isaac & Shadrach,
three Feather Beds and Furniture, her choice, also two painted
dishes, 6^d plates & three or small Basins, one earthen Dish, six
plates, one Spinning Wheel one saw, & Flat Irons, 1st fire Tongs, &c.

Chairs and a Table (her choice) one Trunk also my Horse and Saddle
two Iron pots, one set of knives & Forks of bottom boards, my Loam &
Weaving Loom, all the Articles with the two Negro Boys Isaac & Shadrach
if it is my will and desire that my Wife Elizabeth hold & enjoy so long
as she remains my Widow, and after her death or Marriage, my will &
desire is that every Species of property contained in this clause of my Will
(except the Negro Boy Shadrach) descend to my Youngest Daughter
Sally Williams Dale, which I give to my 1st & 2^d Daughter Sally Williams and
her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Dale one trunk.

Item I give to my daughter Nancy Dale one Chest.

Item I give to my daughter Winfred Dale, one old Chest.

Item I give to my daughter Polly Dale one small Trunk.

Item It is my Will & desire, at the decease or Marriage of my wife
Elizabeth that my Negro Boy Shadrach mentioned in the first clause
of this my Will, descend to my Youngest Son Joseph Dale which
Negro I give to him and his Heirs forever.

Item It is my Will and desire that my four Negroes, Namely, Saml.
George, Lett & her Child Hannah be hired out yearly to the highest
 bidder, tell my Son Joseph shall see fit.

Item It is my Will and desire that my four Negroes, Namely, Sam, George, Lett & her Child Hannah be hired out yearly to the highest bidder till my Son Joseph shall arrive to the Age of Fifteen Years, and the produce arising therefrom to be applied to the support of my Wife Eliz^a and my Seven Children, Namely, Betsey, Archelaus, Nancy, Minfred, Polly, Joseph, and Sally Williams D^{ble}, such as Cloathing, Schooling, my three youngest Children, and paying Rent for my Wife, and all the time that my Sⁿ Joseph shall arrive to the Age of Fifteen Years, The above mentioned Negroes that is to say, Sam, George, Lett & her Child Hannah, and all their future Increase, to be equally divided amongst my Six Children, Betsey, Archelaus, Nancy, Minfred, Polly & Joseph D^{ble} which I give to them and their Heirs forever. all the remainder part of my Estate both real and personal, not heretofore given to be set up and sold & the Money arising from the Sale thereof for the use of my Wife Eliz^a towards finding her Corn, Pork, and such other necessaries as she and my Children heretofore mentioned shall be in want of. I do nominate & appoint my Loving Wife Eliza Executrix and my friend Thomas Davis Executor of the
