possession of his body and for want of such heirs to John Tapley your and his heirs -

and my two best tables and One half of my porches and One Negro Woman named
Sally, and for her board for ever

Item - Give to John Tapley son to One Negro wife slaves, Lucy w. Money which he gives
me up besides of \$100 worth of cattle which I sent by Capt. Stevens and all my ready

- Item - I give to John Tapley Son & One Negro Girl to Name, Lucy or otherwise which his Name
was at the time of his birth of 1666, which I sent by Capt. Haines and all y^r money
thereof.
- Item - I give to Winifred my Daughter to Mr. Peter Griffin and her Affectionate Service, One
Pair of Silk stockings and a Pair of Gloves and Petticoat
- Item - I give to Ann Tapley (Wife of John Tapley my Quilted Petticoat and silk stockings and one
Pair of Silk Stockings)
- Item - I give to William Tapley One Pair of silk Cloth and a Pair of Gloves and a Pair
of Silk Stockings
- Item - I give to Sarah Chapman the wife of John Chapman of New Haven
- Item - I give to Ann Tapley Wife to John Tapley all my Pictures of Friends & Country
is her Son and Daughter Mrs. Elizabeth Tapley and before her Death to go to her Son Tapley
