Item - I Give to Winifred Griffin Daughter to Mr. Peter Griffin and her Sister Alice Griffin, One Piece of Silk Stuff and my best Guttered Gown and petticoat.

Item - I Give to Ann Farpley Wife of John Farpley my quilted petticoat and all the rest and One Piece of Turkey Duvety. - - - - -

Item - I Give to William Glascock One piece of Silk Stuff and one piece of Linnen and half of my Gage. - - - - -

Item - I Give to Elizabeth Dummer One pair of silver Shoes and one Do. petty pair.

Item - I Give to Ann Farpley Wife to Capt. John Farpley all my share in Lancaster County to her for and during her Natural Life and after her Death to go to Capt. John Farpley and his heirs for ever. - - - - -

Item - I Give to John Farpley Son all my Crop of Indian Corn which is made this year 1700 - 1000 hundred and Twenty Six. - - - - -

Item - I Give to John Glasgow One Silk Gown and petticoats of Bape. - - - - -

Item - I Give to Ann Farpley Wife to John Farpley, to Mr. William Glascock and Sarah Glascock Daughter to Tho: Glascock all y^e rest of my wearing Clothes - - - - -

In the Name of God Amen I William Colston of Richmond County being Sick & weak of body but of Sound & perfect Memory do make this my Last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say I Commit my Soul to God Hoping for Salvation thro' the Merits of Our Saviour Jesus Christ and my body to be buried at y^e Discretion of my Executors herein after named, and as to my worldly Goods I Give & Bequeath them in manner following that is to say -

I Give & Bequeath to Each of my Daughters a Negroe when they shall respectively Come to the age of fifteen years or when married which shall first happen. -

My Will is & I do hereby Impower my Executors herein after named to sell & dispose of -
