This day came before me one of his Majesties Justices of peace for this County William Hartley, Isaac Proctor & Garland Moon and being first sworn on the holy Evangelistate severally deposed in manner following that on the 25th day of this Instant They were all present at the house of Mathew Harrison in Farmham Parish where one James Harrison Brother to the said Mathew lay &c but in his perfect senses and memory and that the said James Harrison made a verbal will in the words and to the purpose following as near as they severally can remember It is my desire that my Brother George Harrison shall have my Horse bridle and saddle and that my Brother Benjamin Harrison shall have my Bed, Corn and every thing to me belonging at Cold Garters except my Tobacco that I have there which I desire that my God Daughter Martha Moon may have to pay for her schooling and that my Brother Mathew Harrison shall have my Negro boy Peter and all other Estate to me belonging and I do appoint the said Mathew to be my Executor to see me decently buried and that my Will

may have to pay for her schooling and that my Brother Mathew Harrison shall have my Negro boy Peter and all other Estate to me belonging and I do appoint the said Mathew to be my Executor to see me decently buried and that my Will be performed. They each of them severally farther depose that they know of no Alteration that the said James made in his Will before his death which happened ^{in the morning} of this present day To wit the 27th of December 1756
