Death, have it shall please God to best, I make this my Last Will
& Testament in manner and form following, revoking & annulling
all other Will or Wills formerly by me made either by Word or
Writing, & this to be taken only for my Last Will & Testament
& first being penitent & sorry from the bottom of my heart for all my
Sins past, most especially, Desiring forgiveness for & am hoping
in the Merits & Mediation of my Redeemer Jesus Christ
I shall receive full & perfect forgiveness for all my Sins &c.

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Godson Thomas Bryan as much
Dungon & Callamence as will make him a Suit of Cloaths & three
hundred pounds of Tob^o. to be paid by my Executors hereafter named
for & schooling of the sd Thomas Bryan, when he is full to go to School.

Item I Give & Bequeath to Mary Yeaberton Yeabers of Callamence.

Item I Give & Bequeath to my Godson David Darley as much Dungon
& Callamence as will make him a Suit of Cloaths.

Item I Do hereby make Constituted & appoint my Trusty & well beloved
Friend M^r George Turberville my whole & sole Executor of this my Last
Will & Testament, to w^{ch} I Hereunto sett my hand.

Witness my hand & seal this fifteenth Day of June 1717.
