have full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to be as well
Resurrecting life into my Body. I Comitt to the Earth to be decently buried in the
Mother Church of Kingth. Warrour all the disposition of my Parishers Books & other
names and touching of disposition of all such Temporal Efforts as it hath
pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me. I give & Dispose thereof as followeth
First I Will that my Debts and sundry other Charges shall be paid and discharge
Temp. My Will is that my Land & Tenements be sold and the Money Committed to my
 Loving Brothers Rich^d & Edward Kippax of Warrour to be Equally
Divided between them.
Item. I give unto Rev^d Ralph Tucker my riding Horse, my Silver Drill all
my Books and sundry other papers and to be delivered in and Appraisalment.
Item. I give unto my two sons M^r. Thomas Griffin M^r. Thomas Barle and
Capt^e Charles Barber each of y^e five Pound a piece.
Item. I give unto Patrick Lunn all my wearing Cloths both Washing & Linⁿ.
Item. I give unto James Hartley fifty Shill^{ings} Sterl^{ing} as a bequest of my Sonnets and
All that is not sold of one of my personal Efforts Goods and Chattels at my decease
I do give to be Equally divided among my Loving Brethren Rich^d & Edward Kippax
to be valued and turned into Money.
I do make M^r. Thomas Griffin M^r. Thomas Barle & Capt^e Charles Barber full
sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament; And I do hereby revoke

to be valued and turned into Money.

I do make Mr. Thomas Griffin Mr. Thomas, Squire & Cap. Charles Barber full
true Executors of this my last Will & Testament, And I do hereby make
definitive and make void all former Wills & Testaments be made or made
In Witness whereof I the said Peter Kippax to this my last Will and
Testament have set my hand & Seal this 16th of Nov. 1715.
