

The will & testament of JOHN WILLIAMS M.D. May 1153.

Richard Alderson of the County of Kent was being much and long but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to god and calling to mind the the mortality of my body do make & declare this my last will & Testament and as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I give and dispose of the same in the following manner & form.

First I give & bequeath to my son John Alderson all my Land & my money that remaineth to me & my money that I have to him & his heirs forever. Item I give & bequeath to my son Richard Alderson my ten Acres of Land named Syden & Suddeth & all their houses to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my two sons Richard & Richard Alderson my three women named Beate & all their Incomes as much as may be that shall come within of them which the place where to be maintained by them both of the house to be a charge to them.

Item I give & bequeath all the residue of my Estate to be Equally &

I do hereby convey all my children to them & have them, I do hereby
my son John Adams my Executor of this my last will & Testament to do
lawfully dispose of all personal estate which I own & compare this to be my last will and Testament
in Writings which I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year
