Will of my 33d day and knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die & depart
make and ordaineth to my great Will & remembrance and
from following give and bequeath my soul to God that gave it and
my body to my Son Richard to be buried in the same place
at the discretion of the church where I shall be buried
the General Hospital called the Royal Hospital of Surry
and as touching my No City Estate I direct that it be left to my wife
this 2d of June and dispose of the same as followeth

Item I give unto my daughter Mary Fowler
all my personal Estate except what may be left to my two daughters
to come after me.

Item I give to my daughter Mary Fowler a young man of about 20 years old
I give to my daughter Elizabeth Fowler a man of about 20 years old
Give to my daughter Matilda Fowler a man off four years my Will
y. my three daughters before placed them & more prior to them at the
age of sixteen by my wife Mary Fowler

Item I give to my son David Fowler the plantation my Brother in law
Robert Fowler now lives on and to have it in his possession at the age
of sixteen to him and his for ever

Item My Will is that my wife now goes with her boy and

After I had given the plantation back to him after my Return
I used to turn and think how good it would have been

then - Mr. Bell's death (my brother) brought many afflictions upon me
and I was really ill for a long time - I could not get up without help
and I could not even walk - Will and Estella came to support me
and I am still living though I have not been able to do much of anything
but sitting and reading all day - Mr. Bell before he made his will
left his estate to Will and Estella and me and
other relatives who as I have no male set my hands on his money
