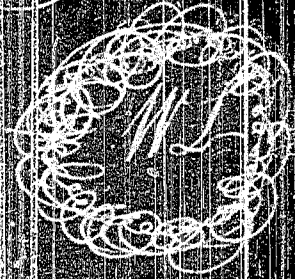

At a Court of quarterly Sessions held for Richmond County the fourth day of May 1784
This last Will and Testament of Richard Frary dec^d being proved in open Court by the
Oaths of two of the Justices thereof was admitted to Record and on the motion of James
Frary one of the Esq^s then present (who made Oath according to Law upon his giving
Security a Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form whereupon
on the said Execution together with William Yates his Security acknowledged themselves
bound (in open Court) in the sum of one hundred pounds for his Just Executors of the said
decedents Estate
