In the Name of God Amen I Richard Hill of Richmond
County being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect
Mind and Memory, Thanks be to Almighty God for it, I do
make Constitute and Appoint this my Last Will and Testament
in manner and form as followeth. That is to say, First I
bequeath and Give unto Almighty God my Saviour and my
Body to be decently (and Christian like) Buried at
Discretion of my Ex. hereafter mentioned. —
Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Son John Hill of Sandwich Plantation
who is now living, after my Loving Wife Elizabeth Hills Death
to him and his Heirs forever, to be Granted of his Body for Ever. —

Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Jennings Five
Thousand Weight of Tobacco.

Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jennings Five
Thousand Weight of Tobacco.

Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Elizabeth Hill all and
singular my Personal Estate whatsoever.

Item. I Do constitute and Appoint my Loving Wife Elizabeth Hill to
be whole and sole Exectrix of this my Last Will and Testament,
and all former Wills by me herebefore made to be void, and
this to stand my Last Will and Testament. Witness my hand and
Seal this 10th of November In, 7 Years of Our Lord 1720.
