

Recorded amongst the Records of Richmond County the first day of
February 1730. - - Test M. Beckwith Esq -

In the Name of God Amen I Richard Hines of y^e County of Richmond being very
sane & of sound Mind full of Age & being in the full Possession of my Reason
do hereby make my Will and to dispose of that Estate which it shall please God to
bestow on me in this world and after all I bequeath my Soul to God that gives it me and
my Body to the Earth to be decently and Christian like buried all y^e direction of my
Executors and after my Just debts paid y^e Rest of my Estate as followeth - -

Item I Give to my three Sons Thomas Hines Charles Hines and James Hines all my Land
I now possess to be divided as followeth beginning at a Laurel Tree standing on y^e
North west Side of a Branch Called y^e Middle Branch thence running through my Orchard
touching y^e Ground into the upper part thence up y^e Ridge to a personer that stands
near the Line of the great patent of Nathl Rogers the 1st Land to Thomas in y^e
possession of my Wife Mary during her life and then to my 3rd Son and the heirs of
their Bodies For Ever the Lower part where I now live I Give to my Son Thomas and
the upper part to my two Sons Charles and James but in Case that Either of my two
Youngest Sons Charles or James should dye without heirs then his part to fall to y^e
Survivor of them two but in Case my Son Thomas should dye without heirs then his
part to be equally divided between y^e other two. - -

Item I Give to my Son Charles One Cow Called Loochy with her Sated increase. -

Item I Give to my Daughter Mary One young Red Cow with her Sated Increase. -

Item. I Give to my Son James one two Year old heffer with her Hutee Increase the which these Cattle are marked with a Eop and two Stills on y^e Right Ear and a Eop and Still on under houle on y^e Left.

Item. I Give to my Son Thomas a Heather Cow and Coughter and a Yegg and too Pelambotts to be paid him at the age of one and Twenty Years.

Item. I Give to my other Three Children Mary Charles and James Each of them a Heather Cow and Coughter and a Yegg and four of Stambotts to be paid them at y^e age of Eighteen Years.

Item. I Give to my Son Thomas my great Table and Horem and an Iron Stoll and to each of my two other Sons an Iron Stoll when they shall Arive to y^e age of 20 years and ally^e Part of my moveable Estate to my Wife during her Natural Life and after her decease to be equally divided amongst my lower Children and I do nominate and appoint my Loving Wife and my Son Thomas to be Executors of this my Last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have Set my hand and Seal this seventh day of January 1720
