do hereby bequeath and devise
touching the disposition of all such Temporal Estate as it hath pleased
Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and devise thereof as followeth.
First I Will that my Debts and funeral Charges be paid and discharged
I Give unto my Son William Harrison my Son and my Son
Sons and I do hereby bequeath and devise

One hundred and fifty acres of land given me by John Harrison to him
and I have of the land. Carefully be taken for Ever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son Aaron Harrison all that tract of
land which was upon to him and of some of his land of my family be taken to
inherit at 100 of Eighteen Years.

Item I Give the other half of this land I have given upon to my loving Wife
Margaret Harrison and after her death to my Son Aaron Harrison to him
and of some of his land lawfully be taken for Ever to be Equally
divided between them, but having a piece of land given to him
I Give upon to him my Name of Thomas Harrison.

Item I Give to my Son Aaron Harrison of other hundred acres of land I have given me by
John Harrison to him and his heirs for Ever to take it at 100 of Eighteen Years
and of my of 1/4 of some of Philadon do before of Com of Eighteen Years
fall to 1/4 of service. I Give and bequeath to my Wife Margaret Harrison and
my Son Aaron Harrison and all my Son Aaron Harrison's children and
one child I leave it to my Son Aaron Harrison but I leave to be equally
divided between my two Son Aaron and George Harrison
I Leave my three Daughters, friends, Mother and the people who I have

and Testament And I do hereby make, declare and establish it
