to Sarah Mortimer Wife of Charles Mortimer my Mother & Grandmother Ming
I Give & Bequeath to Thomas Lawson One Hundred Pounds Virginia Money
All my Wearing Apparel. I Give & Bequeath to William Mendenbrough a
Silver Cup to the Value of Twenty five Pounds Sterling. I Give & Bequeath to
William Neve my Silver Watch & Seal. I Give & Bequeath to Samuel Hebrich
My Negro Carpenter Tom. I Give & Bequeath to my Friend Younger Hebrich
my Gold Seal & between my Negro Woman Dinah Now at John Dors.

I Give & Bequeath to my friend Younger Hebrich all my Land in Sunnysbury
Parish Libanus all the Negroes Working on the said Lands to him During

Life & after Death to have Son Samuel & his Heirs Give & Bequeath to my friend
Younger Hebech all my Money after paying of my Legacies. Give & Bequeath to
Samuel Hebech all my Land in Northfarnham Parish & likewise all the Maimins
of my Negroes not given away before together with the Stocks on the said Land &c. to
Have & his Heirs. Give & Bequeath to my Friend Younger Hebech all my
Household Furniture. Order a Seat Tomb Stone to be sent for
Constitute & appoint William Drakenbrough John Orr & Younger Hebech
Executors of this my Will & Appoint William Drakenbrough Guardian for Samuel
Hebech, In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Tenth Day
of October One thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty
