and give this my last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all
I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of God that gives it and for my body to be buried in a
Decent and Christian like manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting at the
General Resurrection shall Receive the same againe by the mighty Power of God and as Touching
such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give Devise
and Dispose of the same in following manner and forme
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Bruce one Furke and all her Appoyls
washing Cloths and one Feather bed and the Sheets Dyed yellow with lappes and small and all
the Furniture to it and one Cow named Blossie

I give and bequeath to my son William Bruce one Furke and all her Appoyls
washing Cloths and one Feather bed and the Sheets Dyed yellow with lappes and small and all
the Furniture to it and one Cow named Blossie

Give and bequeath to my beloved wife all the Rest of my Estate after my Debts is paid whom I
constitute to make and ordain my only and lawful Executor of this my last Will and Testam.
and I do hereby utterly Disavow all other Former Testaments wills and Legacies Bequests or
Executors by me in any life before this time made or Willa do Ratifying and Confirming this to
be my last Will and Testament In Wit whereof I have hereunto set my hand and the day
year above writing
