Item. I give and bequeath 2 Cows and 2 Calfs to my Mother Katherine Clark. —

Item. I give & bequeath to my dear Wife all the rest of my Cattle a yoke and a good Iron Stone bottom Churn and a feather Bed and furniture belonging to it 4 Sows and 1 barrow and 2 pigs and the five loads of lumber and a trunk and a suit and couple of kettles and my share of the Crapp and all my wearing apparel. —

Item. I give and bequeath a hand saw and a hand to my Wife and if she dies without heirs then it is to be divided between my Mother Robert Clark Charles Clark and my Wife and I desire that my Wife and my Mother should have all the said things and I desire that my Wife to be my heir for ever of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto signed my hand and the seal of my said last will and Testament. —
