God for it do nominate this to be my last will and Testament in manner & form following
I begueth my soul to God for it who gave it and my body to be buried as my
last hereafter named shall think fit.

Item I give to my living wife what I had with her & the half of my moveable Estate
to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Thomas Freshwater my Plantation where I now live according
to the Deed Recorded in Court likewise I give to him my best young mare my set
of ammunition some one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son George Freshwater one shilling to prevent him coming in for any
of the rest of my Estate.

Item it is my will that if my Daughter Ann should be a live that she should have
one shilling likewise.

Item It is my will that all the Rest of my Estate to be sold at auction and the money to
be Divided between my two Children Cheubin Freshwater and Mary Freshwater.

Item It is my will that William White should have my son Cheubin til he arrives
to the age of twenty one years & what shall be his part of my Estate I leave to William

to the Deeds Recorded in Court likewise I give to him my biggest young mare my set of ammunition arms one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs for ever —
Item: I give to my son George Freshwater one shilling to prevent him coming in for any of the rest of my Estate —

Item: it is my will that if my Daughter Ann should be a live that she should have one shilling likewise —

Item: It is my will that all the Rest of my Estate to be sold at auction and the money to be Divided between my two Children Cheubin Freshwater and Mary Freshwater?

Item: It is my will that William White should have my son Cheubin til he arrives to the age of twenty one years & what shall be his part of my Estate I leave to William White till he should be of Age —

Item: I do nominate my loving wife & John Jesper my whole & sole Ex^{rs} to this my last will & testament in Witnes whereof I have set my hand and fixt my seal this 5th day of May 1754 —
