Richmond Being very sick and weak in body But of Perfect mind and
memory Thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make and Deliver
This as my Last will and Testament and what worldly Goods it hath
Pleas'd Almighty God to Indue me with after my debts are paid and

Funeral Charges Discharged. I dispose of in manner and form following
To wit) I give to my son Thomas Jesper fifty two and a half acres of land
where he now lives and fifty acres more or less now in Possession of my
Brother John Jesper. Land that my Grandfather Richard Jesper bought
of Richard Dudley these two parcels of Land above mentioned I give
To my son Thomas Jesper and his heirs Lawfully begotten of his Body
For ever. and for want of such Issue to my son Daniel Jesper and his
Heirs for ever I give to my son Daniel Jesper fifty acres of Land
adjoining the Land that I have given to my son Thomas Jesper and I
also give to my son Daniel Jesper the plantation or Tract of Land I now
Live on to him and his Heirs for ever Lawfully begotten of his Body
and for want of such Issue to my son Thomas Jesper and his Heirs for
Ever. and if please god Both my above mentioned sons should Depart
This life without leaving a Lawfull heir. then my will and desire is
That all my afore mentioned Lands be Equally Devided Between my two
Sons Thomas and Daniel Jesper.

That all my afore mentioned Lands be Equally Devided Between my two Daughters Mary ann Jesper and Betty Jesper. I leave all my Negroes To be Equally devided Between my four Children. Thomas Jesper Daniel Jesper Mary ann Jesper and Betty Jesper and all shall Bear an Equal Part of the Law suit now Commenc'd against me for my Negro man duke And if he be lost in the Law suit it shall be an Equal Los to Each one of my afore mentioned Children. and I leave the Care of my daughter Betty Jesper and her part of my Estate To my son Daniel Jesper. if she shall Like to live with him or under his Care if not my desire is that she may Chuse a guardian and have her part of the Estate out of his hands. and I Leave to my son Daniel Jesper one Bed and to my Daughter Mary ann Jesper one Bed and to my daughter Betty Jesper one Bed that is the three Beds shall be Equally devided between them my above mentioned three Children and all the Remaining part of my Estate I leave to be Equally devided between my four Childred Thomas Jesper Daniel Jesper Mary

ann Jesper and Betty Jesper. 1800 in the month of April

Leave to my son Daniel Jesper one Bed and to my Daughter Mary Ann
Jesper one Bed and to my daughter Betty Jesper one Bed that is the three
Beds shall be Equally divided between them my above mentioned three
Children and all the Remaining part of my Estate I leave to be Equally
divided between my four Children Thomas Jesper Daniel Jesper Mary
Ann Jesper and Betty Jesper and I leave the Care of Francis Eords Children
and their Estates to my son Daniel Jesper and I appoint and leave my two
sons Thomas Jesper and Daniel Jesper my Ex^{ors} of this my last will and
Testament and do Revok and make void all other wills by me written or
spoken and Acknowledges this to be my Last will and Testament in witness
