should have the same. I am making this my Will to be

for it do make up herein this to be my Last Will & Testament in manner &
form following viz First I give & bequeath my body to the Earth to be
buriedly buried at y^e Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned

and my Soul to God who gave it in sure & certain hope of
to Eternal Life through Jesus Christ and I have given it
hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as followeth (viz)
I give to my Daughter Sarah I cannot but hundred pounds of Tobacco to be paid
out of my Crop & put into the hands of Joseph Brother & by him to be laid out in
Cloaths for my s^r Daughter Sarah. —

Item. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth I cannot but hundred pounds of Tobacco to be paid
out of my Crop & put into the hands of Joseph Brother & by him to be laid out in
Cloaths for my s^r Daughter Elizabeth. —

Item. I give to my Daughter Sarah one black Trooper with a Star in her forehead &
goes by the Name of Blacks Ealing. —

Item. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one Brindley Pice Trooper & Calfs of my
own Mark. —

Item. I give to my son William I cannot my Gun & Coopers Tools. —

Item. I leave my son Thomas I cannot to the Care & Management of Joseph
Brother till he shall arrive to the Age of Eighteen Years but if the said
Brother dies before of said time my Will is that my said son shall be left
to the Care of the Court either to Continue him or remove him as they shall
think fit. —

Item. I leave to Joseph Brother & his Wife Margaret Brother my Daughter Catherine
I cannot till she shall arrive to the Age of Seventeen Years. —

Item. I leave to my loving Wife Sarah I cannot my Daughter Mary I cannot till she
shall arrive to the Age of Seventeen Years but if my Wife dies before of said
time I leave my Daughter at her own Disposal. —

Item. I leave to my Daughter Mary and my son Thomas & my Daughter Catherine
two hundred pounds of Tobacco to be paid out of my Crop to Joseph —

time I leave my Daughter at her own Disposal. —
Item. I leave to my Daughter Mary and my Son Thomas & my Daughter Catherine
two hundred pounds of Tobacco to be paid out of my Chest to Joseph
Strother by him to be laid out for Cloathing for my said three Children.

Item. I give to my Daughter Mary Parcel one Black Cow with a Star in her
fore head of my own proper Mark with all her future Increase to be
Delivered to her at the said Settlement of mine by my Executors.

Item. I leave all the rest of my personal Estate to be Equally Divided
between my Loving Wife Sarah Pennel & the Child she now bears in the
Case of that Child being my Will & that my Wife have all & commanding
part of my Personal Estate.

Item. I give to the Child my Wife now goes with (if it be a Son) all my Land & in
Case it be a Daughter I give all my Land to my Son Thomas Pennel & his
heirs forever & for the Service of my Wife she having the Plantation
whereon I now live during her life.

I make my Loving Wife Sarah Pennel full sole Executrix of this my
Last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this 9th of October Anno Domini 1718. —
